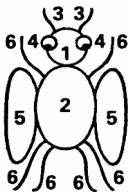

Wine Trip to Kent – Tuesday 12 August

A collection of 40 members from all four wine groups and other sundry hangers-on assembled at the West Maldon Community Centre at 0830 and set off for sunny Kent, picking up another couple in Danbury on the way. A short delay at the Dartford Crossing saw us arrive at our first winery at 10.40, a mere 10 minutes behind schedule.

Chapel Down winery in Tenterden is one of the largest in England. They have 20 acres under cultivation locally and a further 100 acres on the North Downs. Our party was divided into two and led around the vineyard by guides Susie and Jo. One of the highlights was observing the bottling plant in action as it processed, capped and labelled bottles of sparkling wine.

We tasted between six and seven wines in a small tasting room where our guides talked us through the wines and provided detailed tasting notes. Most of the wines were well received; only the Union Red (Pinot Noir/Rondo blend) seemed to disappoint.

After a quick look around their shop we were all bundled back onto the coach by Paul and off we zoomed to Biddenden Vineyard, a mere 25 minutes away. There we were greeted by our loquacious guide, Malcolm, who ushered us into their small café for a delicious ploughman's lunch.

Malcolm then took us on a guided tour of the vineyard, which he claimed was the oldest family-owned vineyard in England and Wales. The Barnes family, who grew apples there from 1953 until 1969, uprooted their orchards and began planting vines. They produced their first wines in 1973. However, because of their association with the apple trade the vineyard still produces apple juice and cider; all made from local apples sourced from the surrounding farms.

The tasting at Biddenden was poor compared with Chapel Down. There was no structure to it; one just queued up at the sales desk and sampled whatever one wished. But the amounts poured were too small to form reasoned opinions of their wines.

We departed at 16.20 and in spite of more fun and games at the Dartford Crossing, we arrived safe and sound at WMCC at 1845. The weather was sunny all day, albeit breezy, and although rain threatened once or twice it never quite materialised. Thanks to Paul and Mary (or Rita as Paul called her – anyone know why?) for arranging such a super day out.
